These guidelines were included in the community message sent yesterday and are posted on our website under "Reopening 2020-2021."










First step to reopening:

Athletic and Marching Band
Health and Safety Plan must be
Board approved prior to the start of
any athletic or marching band
activities.

This plan is posted in Board docs under motion J for tonight's meeting.

Key Components:

- Education for coaches
- A risk readiness assessment
- COVID mitigation plan
- Positive cases/screening procedures
- Coach questionnaire/checklist
- Ongoing planning and preparedness and,
- Use of indoor facilities for school athletic teams/band



Second step to reopening:

Palisades School District Health and Safety Plan (released June 5, 2020) must be Board approved prior to the start of any school affiliated activities.

Summer meeting date will be discussed tonight by the Board under the discussion section of the agenda.

Key Components:

- Establishment of Pandemic
 Coordinator and Team
- Plan development in the following areas:
 - Cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting and ventilation
 - Social distancing and other safety protocols
 - Monitoring student and staff health
 - ProfessionalDevelopment



Members of Health and Safety Team include: administrators, teachers & medical personnel, support staff member, parents


- Reviewed DOH Guidelines and Plan Template on June 17, 2020
